ABSTRACT

Tourism industry plays a key role in Malaysia's economy. However, there has been an absence of comprehensive policies on the industry and part of the reasons lies in the fact that there is no one set of laws that could be said as comprehensive and able to provide the framework for the tourism industry. By acknowledging that tourism industry, being one of the oldest industry in the world, is influenced by Islamic teachings, therefore, it follows that reference to the Shari>can be the ideal option in designing the complete framework for laws and policies for the tourism industry. However, such approach has not been taken in Malaysia. Findings indicate that the laws and policies to regulate the industry have been put in place mostly as a reaction to developments in the industry. This underlines the lack of planning and coordination between the states and between federal and state governments. To a large extent this has been due to the existence of overlapping of powers between the federal, state and local authorities. The problem has escalated when certain states were controlled by political parties in opposition to the central government. However, the overlaps in jurisdiction should not be a reason not to cooperate to formulate laws to regulate tourism industry in Malaysia. Political parties and rivalries should not be a problem indeed. Here lies the importance of realising the crucial role of tourism in the economy and of course the democratic nature of politics. Apart from that, inconsistent policies adopted by the federal government so far-despite the novel objective of facilitating the tourism industry—have not been good to national identity. These policies have also been at odd with the environment. Thus, the study proposes that while the management of the globalisation process is for federal authorities to deal with, the states and local authorities should be allowed to handle matters not falling under the former. Local communities should also be given more space to get involved in tourism ventures. This leads to the next proposition of this study; namely, the participation of public interest groups and public participation in the proceedings of the courts. Indeed, there is enough justification for this under the existing public law theory. As far as the research methodology is concerned, while fact-finding is primarily library-based, some interviews have also been conducted. These include discussions and interviews with the policy-makers and major players in the industry. Since tourism is concerned with wide combination of sub-sectors, laws and policies from selected ASEAN as well as the Commonwealth and European countries, United Kingdom and the United States are referred to in situations where it is necessary and suitable for the Malaysian context.

ملخص البحث

أن صناعة السياحة تلعب دورا أساسيا لإقتصاد ماليزيا. ولكن هناك تفقد السياسة الكاملة تجاه هذه الصناعة، وبعض أسبابة قد ترجع إلى غياب مجموعة من القوانين التي تستطيع أن تقدم هيكلا مبتكرا لهذه الصناعة. أن صناعة السياحة من أقدم الصناعات في العالم. فهي قد تأثرت بتعاليم الإسلام. ولأجل ذلك ستكون الشريعة الإسلامية خيارا أمثل في تخطيط المشروع الكامل للقوانين والسياسة لهذه الصناعة. ولكن هذه المنهج لم يأخذ سبيله في ماليزيا. أن نتائج البحث تشير إلى أن القوانين والسياسة التي تنظم هذه الصناعة أكثرها كانت نتيجة للتطورات الملموسة لهذه الصناعة فحسب. هذا الوضع يشير إلى عدم وجود المشروع والتعاون المشترك به الولايات وحكومة ماليزيا المركزية. زيادة على أن هذا الوضع ينشأ لأجل وجود القوى السياسة المتصارعة بين الحكومة المركزية والولايات من جانب، ومن جانب أخر بين الحكومة المركزية والسلطات المحلية. وتزيد المشكلة من حدتها عندما كانت بعض الولايات تتحكم فيها الأخراب السياسية المعارضة للحكومة المركزية. ولكن هذا التنازع القانوني لم يكن ذريعة إلى عدم وجود التعاون المشترك لتصييغ القوانين التي تنظم صناعة السياحة في ماليزيا. حقا إن وجود الأحزاب السياسية المتعارضة لا تكون مشكلة من المشاكل. هنا يظهر مدى أهمية الدور المحاسم للسياحة في الإقتصاد بجانب التنفيذ الصحيح للديمقراطية في السياسة. وبجانب ذلك هناك التضارب وعدم الثبات على السياسة الواحدة التي تمارسها الحكومة المركزية. وهذا يتعارض مع الهدفُ الجدى في تيسير الصناعة وقد يكون عنصرا غير مرغوب فيه للهوية الوطنية، والبيئة. لأجل ذلك أن هذا البحث يقترح أنه عندما كانت معالجة مشكلة العولمة تحت سلطة الحكومة المركزية فمن الأرجح أن يمنح الحق للولايات والسلطات المحلية تدبير بعض الأمور التي لم تكن تحت سلطة الحكومة المركزية. وكذلك من الأجدى أن تعطى للمجتمعات المحلية فرصة التداخل والممارسة في مشروعات سياحية. هذا يمهد السبيل إلى أن يقترح البحث ممارسة الجماعة التي لها المصلحة العامة ومزاولة العامة في مرافعات المحاكم. حقا هناك مبرر قانوني في هذا الصدد بناء على نظرية القانون العام. وعلى قدر ما يهتم به أسلوب البحث ومنهاجه فإن البحث عن الحقائق والمعلومات مبنى على البحث المكتبى، ولكن هناك بعض المقابلات قد جرت تنفيذها. هذه تنضمن المشاورات والمقابلات مع واضعى السياسة وممارسي الكبار لهذه الصناعة. وعندما كانت السياحة تهتم بمجموعة مؤتلفة من القطا عات الفرعية، فقوانين وسياسات بعض الأعضاء المختارة من دول 'ASEAN' وكذلك 'COMMONWEALTH' ودول أوربا، وإنجلترا، وأمريكا تكون مراجعا في مواقع ومواضع مناسبة وضرورية بالنسبة إلى ماليزيا.

CHAPTER ONE

INTRODUCTION

1.0 BACKGROUND OF STUDY

Today, in Malaysia, the tourism industry is one of the most important industries, which has contributed greatly to the income of the country. This industry is not new to our country as since the time of the Malacca sultanate in the early history of Tanah Melayu, tourism was an important industry which contributed to the economy of the state. Hence, one of the first written code during that time, *Undang-Undang Melaka* impliedly provides the rules which were applied to the travellers then. From the various provisions of the code, it can be construed that the law that applies to the travellers then were the natural law based on the grounds of morality, where the rules of obligation were the core concept. Since trade was the main purpose of the travellers, tortuous aspect of travellers and occupants for example, were illustrated impliedly in many of the provisions in the *Undang-undang Melaka*. During the British rule, the introduction of the Innkeepers Ordinance which was then replaced with the Innkeepers Act 1952⁴ (herein after referred to as the 1952 Act) was the only specific statute that governed the travellers and the providers of accommodation.

As tourism industry grew around the world and became an integral part of the fabric of modern life, its international dimension increased and national governments
